This presentation will provide a brief and basic overview of the leadership model known as Simplified, Accountable Structure (SAS).

What would it mean to change the work and conversation around your church's leadership table to focus on mission and less on structure? SAS is a modified governing model that combines the traditional functions of Church Council, Finance, Trustees, and SPRC to create a holistic leadership lens for the church to ensure all ministries and use of resources align with the congregation's mission, vision, and values. Grounded in missional accountability, a SAS Board is able to claim opportunities and face challenges with more agility and flexibility for our postmodern culture.

THE CHURCH HAS LITERALLY **LEFT THE BUILDING: PROPERTY** REDEVELOPMENT TO LIVE INTO GOD'S VISION

Two unique stories of living into God's vision through redevelopment of a church's property. In the summer of 2021 Central UMC temporarily relocated so that their existing structure could be demolished. The new structure will be an eight-story building to provide space for worship, pre-school, a commercial kitchen for continued feeding ministries, and 144 committed affordable rental units. The many challenges along this journey grew the resiliency of Central UMC, and they are excited about this new space that will allow them to continue to worship God, serve others, and embrace all. In late 2022 Arlington Temple UMC will temporarily relocate so that their existing structure can be demolished. The new facility will be built to relate better with the emerging community as Rosslyn redevelops with hi-rise commercial and residential properties intermixed. A relocated entrance and building design to serve future generations will allow this congregation to live into God's vision for their future. A workshop by Rev. Sarah Harrison-McQueen and Rev. This workshop will share real-life situational response to crisis, lessons learned, and best practices.
